The aim of the Centre is to highlight, promote and protect the ecological and cultural characteristics of the valley, thus contributing to the sustainable development of the area.

In the valley of Ezousa visitors can observe 12 different types of habitats, 150 species of birds, mammals, many species of flora and the "Meteora of Cyprus", the largest monolithic volume of the island. The visit to the Centre is a unique experience. The scientific staff offers a guided tour of the exhibits and dioramas, which includes embalmed animals and birds, high quality photographic material, insects and geology exhibits from the area.
